8. COUNTY REPORT:

Commissioner John Smelker reported the following:

It has been a slow month. The Board heard reports on finances, state trial court funding, drain code and the road commission.

9. RESERVED TIME: Steve Shults with Bloomingdale Communications

Steve Shults presented information on an approved project to build out broadband (fiber) to Thornapple Twp residents. He presented a map showing the area that is approved. They have moved forward with engineering doing staking and fielding. All contracts have been signed and they are ready for USDA to do environmental and historical preservation approvals. They don't expect any archeological issues, but there may be a consideration for the Eastern Mississauga rattlesnake. They will obtain clearance from the Gun Lake Tribe. This USDA project is 7.5 million dollars. They are hoping to do a formal bid process and have it wrapped up to start the project by spring of 2026. Additionally, they are looking at a BEAD project to do additional areas in the township and have re-submitted that application. BEAD stands for Broadband Everywhere Access Deployment - a federal program that was part of the infrastructure act. Michigan was allocated 1.6 billion dollars to expand broadband throughout Michigan. The State will award these projects in approximately 4-6 weeks. Meetings have been held with the Road Commission, the Village Manager, the Property and Public Utilities committee, and several people from Public works. Bloomingdale Communications is a small company and their emphasis is on serving rural folks and affordability. Since 2018 they have invested 48 million dollars in getting rural fiber to homes. They have been in business since 1905 and will be the provider for the service to the township. He expresses his desire to improve this service in this community. They will offer more information to the community when construction begins.

They do not need anything from the township but are here to communicate who they are and present their expected work.
